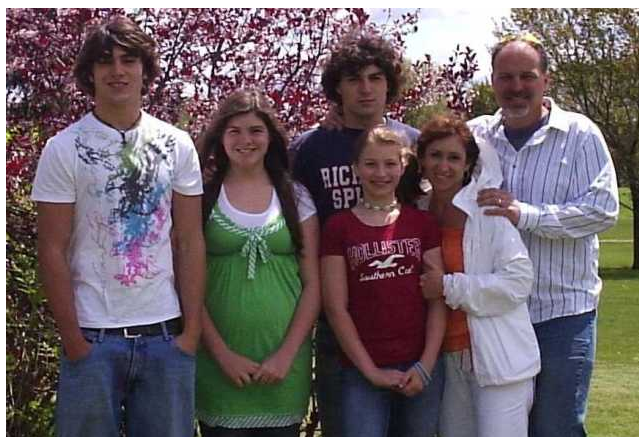

Shared in preaching rotation and helped lead church through interim period. Varsity football coach and Chaplin at Howell High School in MI, established Fellowship of Christian Athletes on multiple campuses. Recently, church replaced Senior Pastor. Although proving to be a challenge, First Baptist has the potential, on the horizon, to begin to move out of its present thirty-five year plateau into a growing vibrant church. I began an exciting 6th grade ministry called OaSix, I worked with 6th-College age, oversaw Recreation Ministry, developed a new Worship Arts University with students, worked with GraceFest Team (a city-wide street festival on the front steps of our church) and led the North American Mission Board and the City of Pensacola to bring World Changers to Pensacola as Project Coordinator. FRANKLIN, TENNESSEE

Serving here was a highlight in my ministry opportunities as I was part of the exceptionally balanced approach between seeker sensitive corporate worship and the Sunday Bible Study. Serving this Church alongside eighteen exciting ministers was a blessing. Average Youth Sunday Bible Study attendance for 7th-12th grade increased from 210 in 1996 to over 290 in 1998 (despite having to meet in four different locations within that time). By the end of 1999, in new space, Youth Sunday School attendance increased to 320. Leadership here provided me with the privilege to be a part of setting national and international standards for youth ministry curriculum and support with Lifeway leaders. Missions involvement, among students, nearly doubled each year from 30 participants in 1995 to over 180 students on six Mission trips in 1999. I also gave leadership to the Recreation Ministry Team multiplying the involvement and outreach potential of that ministry. (Church attendance Average: 2,800-3,000)

God opened this opportunity to minister here to students while I completed Seminary and began Ph.D. studies. Students and leaders here had struggled in ministering to youth in the past. The primary objective here was to develop a strong leadership base and help organize the church for effective ministry to students. In the first 8 months of ministry, average Youth Sunday School Attendance quickly reached record numbers for Burleson from 62 to 100 in that time. Establishing Ministry Lead Teams and developing creative mid-week student events helped growth to continue under the next leadership with average Youth Sunday School attendance reaching 150 in 1998. (attendance average: 800-1,100)

My Philosophy of Leadership and Ministry

My philosophy of leadership is founded in Jesus' statement that those who lead do so in order to serve others. I believe that leadership is first a matter of Christ-like character, and then a matter of ability. I also believe that leadership must be by example, and that influencing others towards Christ requires the development of environments and relationships of genuine love and acceptance.

I believe that ministry is about people, not programs, and that ministry is for God's people, not just professionals. As a pastor-teacher, my responsibility is to use my spiritual gifts of pastor/shepherd, evangelism, and faith, to equip people to do the work of ministry. I view myself as a shepherd (loving people), a coach (helping people maximize their passions, gifts, personality, and experiences for Christ) and also as a choreographer (helping people, teams, and ministries function together to multiply their effectiveness).

In particular, I believe that a Pastor of a church should preach and teach the scriptures; pray; exemplify commitment to Christ and obedience to His commands; be burdened for the spiritual health and vitality of the congregation; recruit, develop, and lead leaders (including ministry staff if applicable); help establish direction and cast vision for the ministry; lead the ministry in reaching out to the community and the world; join with other shepherds of the church to provide pastoral care, and be cognizant of and sensitive to the operational side of the ministry (i.e. budget, facilities, etc).
