Personal Ministry Statement

Core Values: the things that guide Church decisions

The Bible is the Truth for regular people living everyday life.

We (*the Church*) value the Bible as God's inerrant and infallible statement of truth that leads to salvation and spiritual maturity; therefore, we will teach and preach the scriptures with integrity and clarity, showing people how truth can and should transform their daily lives. 2 Timothy 3:15-17

The Church is a family.

We value people knowing, loving and serving each other; therefore, we will be together in environments that encourage transparency and caring. 1 John 3:16-18

Prayer gets us aligned with God.

We value God's power at work in and through us; therefore we will incorporate prayer into every aspect of our life and ministry. Acts 4:31; Colossians 4:2

Unity is mission critical.

We value unity amongst our church family; therefore, we will follow Christ together, looking out for the best interest of others, and staying focused on our mission. Phil. 2:2-5

The Church is a picture of Jesus Christ.

We value being an accurate picture of Jesus Christ; therefore we will encourage and model personal integrity and moral purity in our lives. Ephesians 5:1-4

The gospel really is good news.

We value the good news that people can have a relationship with God through Jesus Christ; therefore, we will focus our energy and resources on sharing this message with people in our community and around the world. Matthew 28:18-20; Acts 1:8; 4:12; Romans 1:16

Following Jesus Christ is an adventure.

We value a spirit of adventure in our ministry; therefore, we will be flexible in our methods and open to taking measured risks in order to influence our friends and neighbors with the good news of Jesus Christ. 1 Corinthians 9:22

Vision: What I see for the future of the Church

God has placed the Church in place and time by His design, for now. As I look to the future, I envision the Church being a place where:

- 1) the Bible is taught in a clear, interesting, and practical way;
- 2) unconditional love for one another is the norm;
- 3) prayer is woven through every aspect of our church life and ministry;
- 4) every involved person is intentionally developed towards maturity, ministry, and mission;
- 5) the methods and styles change with the times but the message remains the same;
- 6) the staff and leadership are united in cause and purpose, bonded and faithful to one another as a model to the community and the world of Christ's love;
- 7) strategic partnerships are formed with like-minded ministries for the purpose of impacting our community and our world for Jesus Christ;
- 8) the Church will multiply by developing church leaders and launching them into church ministry.

Local and World Missions Ministry of the Church

My experience for leading Missions Ministry is rooted in the experience God has given me and grows out of what opportunities, for honoring God, that are still ahead of me. Beginning with what foundations have been successfully established within the present Missions Leadership of the Church, through prayer, a Missions Ministry Leadership Team should be continually strengthened. Establishing or strengthening policies, education, support and Great Commission fulfillment strategies should be developed with the greatest potential for effective, quality, positive, God honoring results.

My Missions Philosophy of the Church

I believe that the missions philosophy of the Church should affirm that the purpose of all Christian activity is to glorify God (Rom. 15:6; 1 Cor. 10:31). God is glorified when we acknowledge the greatness of His person and His works, and when we are faithfully responsive to His revealed will.

Acknowledging that the New Testament purposes of the church include worshipping God, evangelism, edification/discipleship, compassionate/missions ministry, and Body life/fellowship, both home and abroad, I believe, that the Church should constantly endeavor to carry out an effective strategy to follow Christ's directive until He returns.

The Great Commission (Matt. 28:19-20) is obeyed when people are introduced to Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord (evangelism), and when they are guided to spiritual maturity in obeying Christ (discipleship/edification), and when they worship God from a pure heart (worship). Thus, I believe it is the responsibility of each Christian to do his/her part first of all in their home region. Then, collectively, through the local church, believers send missionaries throughout the world according to Christ's on-going directive. Christ said, "*I will build my church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it*" (Matt. 16:18).

It is recognized that the Book of Acts presents the principle that world missions (home and abroad) is to be accomplished by local churches - local churches that select, send, and support missionaries to evangelize and disciple peoples of other cultures with a view to starting other local churches and to bring them to maturity. In addition, participating with a network of other common believing Christians/Churches can often help to maximize their potential by cooperating together to fulfill the Great Commission.

While it is apparent from the Bible that every believer is a witness for Jesus Christ (Acts 1:8), it should be realized that certain believers, with special gifts and abilities, will be selected by the Holy Spirit through the local church and sent out by the church as missionaries.

Mutual accountability and responsibility should exist between the local church (and/or missions organization) and the missionaries. Guidelines should be agreed upon by those appointed to establish and support them (Missions Ministry Team), with the approval of the Church Body. God works in unique ways and should not be limited by such guidelines, therefore, the guidelines should not be rigid in all cases, but shall serve to guide the Missions Committee in its decisions.

Strategically, the Church should continually pray, prepare, educate, support and be actively involved in fresh ways to carry out the Great Commission. Successful ministry is most effectively evaluated by the obedience to this directive. Missions Education, Missions giving, continual challenge to personally participate, organize and plan domestic and foreign mission opportunities (life, long term and short term) should be at the core of the Mission Ministry Team actions. An Acts 1:8 Strategy is best implemented when every believer and organization of believers have a three-fold personal target: 1. Local, 2. Regional and 3. Cross-Cultural. After determining if a Mission/Ministry opportunity matches the churches purpose, certain filters should be considered by the Missions Ministry Team, as led by the Holy Spirit.

Statement of Faith

I, Kent Williams, Believe...

1. The Scriptures, both Old and New Testaments, to be the inspired Word of God, without error in the original writings, the complete revelation of His will for the salvation of men and the Divine and final authority for Christian faith and life.
2. In one God, Creator of all things, infinitely perfect and eternally existing in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
3. That Jesus Christ is true God and true man, having been conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He died on the cross, a sacrifice for our sins according to the Scriptures. Further, He arose bodily from the dead, ascended into heaven, where, at the right hand of the Majesty on High, He is now our High Priest and Advocate.
4. That the ministry of the Holy Spirit is to glorify the Lord Jesus Christ and, during this age, to convict men, regenerate the believing sinner, and indwell, guide, instruct and empower the believer for godly living and service.
5. That man was created in the image of God but fell into sin and is, therefore, lost, and only through regeneration by the Holy Spirit can salvation and spiritual life be obtained.
6. That the shed blood of Jesus Christ and His Resurrection provide the only ground for justification and salvation for all who believe, and only such as receive Jesus Christ are born of the Holy Spirit and, thus become children of God.
7. That water baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances to be observed by the Church during the present age. They are, however, not to be regarded as means of salvation.
8. That the true Church is composed of all such persons who through saving faith in Jesus Christ have been regenerated by the Holy Spirit and are united together in the Body of Christ of which He is the Head.
9. That only those who are, thus, members of the true Church shall be eligible for membership in the local church.
10. That Jesus Christ is the Lord and Head of the Church and that every local church has the responsibility, under Christ, to decide and govern her own affairs.

11. In the personal and pre-millennial and imminent coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and that this "Blessed Hope" has a vital bearing on the personal life and service of the believer.
12. In the bodily resurrection of the dead; of the believer to everlasting blessedness and joy with the Lord; of the unbeliever to judgment and everlasting conscious punishment.

My Ministry Objective

My ministry objective is to serve Christ as a pastor in a local church that needs a visionary, relational leader who increasingly loves God and genuinely loves people. Serve a Church that desires a pastor who has a passion for clear and creative Bible teaching, leadership development, a passion for local, regional, domestic and international outreach.

My Philosophy of Leadership and Ministry

My philosophy of leadership is founded in Jesus' statement that those who lead do so in order to serve others. I believe that leadership is first a matter of Christ-like character, and then a matter of ability. I also believe that leadership must be by example, and that influencing others towards Christ requires the development of environments and relationships of genuine love and acceptance.

I believe that ministry is about people, not programs, and that ministry is for God's people, not just professionals. As a pastor-teacher, my responsibility is to use my spiritual gifts of pastor/shepherd, evangelism, and faith, to equip people to do the work of ministry. I view myself as a shepherd (loving people), a coach (helping people maximize their passions, gifts, personality, and experiences for Christ) and also as a choreographer (helping people, teams, and ministries function together to multiply their effectiveness).

In particular, I believe that a Pastor of a church should preach and teach the scriptures; pray; exemplify commitment to Christ and obedience to His commands; be burdened for the spiritual health and vitality of the congregation; recruit, develop, and lead leaders (including ministry staff if applicable); help establish direction and cast vision for the ministry; lead the ministry in reaching out to the community and the world; join with other shepherds of the church to provide pastoral care, and be cognizant of and sensitive to the operational side of the ministry (i.e. budget, facilities, etc).

My Spiritual Gifts

Discovering and understanding His gifts in my life has helped me most to understand my SHAPE, and what God has called me to and into. I continue so grow and develop many of God's wonderful gifts in my life. Primarily present and exhibited in my life would be the spiritual gift, *Pastor/Shepherd*. Secondly, but very close to Pastor/Shepherd, is the gift of *Evangelism & Faith*. Pastor/Shepherd, I believe is the Spirit-given capacity and desire to serve God by overseeing, training and caring for the needs of a group of Christians. The Shepherd who leads and feeds, the coach of the "TEAM".

I have seen and had others confirm seeing these Characteristic traits in my life as a result of this giftedness: I am typically very patient with people. I am also willing to spend time praying for others needs. I am people-centered, and I love them. I am more a leader than a follower, expressive, composed and sensitive. I often draw people to myself easily. I feel that I have a pleasing and friendly personality which I believe is a direct result of the genuine care I have for people and my desire to be willing to help anyone God places in my path.

Some burdens and desires I have as a result: I have a burden to see others learn, grow and mature. I am optimistic and protective of others. I usually don't like presenting the same material twice, but do so when it is effective, important and/or not heeded. I am willing to study what is necessary to guide others in the correct path. I am more relationship oriented than task oriented. I

have a high sense of empathy and tolerance of others shortcomings. I can often help others resolve their problems and differences, helping to bring compromise in a peaceful way. I am often sensitive to hurt feelings or problems which cause a loss of unity, but will occasionally miss this due sometimes to an overly optimistic outlook. I am more concerned about doing for others than others doing for me. I am faithful, devoted and often work too hard. However, I have slowly learned that sharing leadership and responsibilities is far more efficient and much more effective.

Some needs and weaknesses: While being ambitious, assertive, enterprising, outgoing... I can sometimes be too much so and get too far out in front of the people I am leading. While I will accomplish what I start, there are sometimes things that just don't have to be finished by me. I enjoy most seeing others capture vision and carry it out, and have incredibly improved at allowing others to go about something differently than I would. I am better at being willing to risk that something will not succeed or be carried out in the way I think it should be. I do get excited when I realize a need or weak area in my life, and see myself improve and become stronger at overcoming that weakness... because it is always something that God does in my life, and I am glad to see Him working in me.

The gift of *Evangelism & Faith*, I also see as a wonderful Spirit-given gift that I have. This desire to serve God by leading people, beyond my natural sphere of influence, to the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ is always near the front of my motives.

Characteristically, I seldom meet a stranger and I get along well with others. I am more often light hearted, expressive in speech and communication. As mentioned before, I am patient and tolerant of people and their weaknesses, and sympathetic to sinners. I really enjoy seeing people come to know Jesus Christ.

Multiple Psychological Inventories suggest that I am an "Alpha," a "D" on the "DISC." The suggestion is that I am unusually favorable to have exceptional initiative, self-confidence, constructive ambition, effective decision-making skills and a talent for leadership and creativity.

Some interesting things about me....

Devotional Life. Look forward to it. I use to have more regular times with my family in daily devotions, but not as often as when they were younger and on a unified schedule. However, we are still able to capture 3-4 times a week at our dinner table, and often spiritual devotion is a natural part of that experience. Personally, first thing in the morning at my office, behind closed door, I meet with my Master each day. I read in the Proverbs, often a bit of a devotional book, read a portion of scripture, sometimes in a plan or purpose to learn or understand something God is teaching me at the time. I write in my Spiritual Journey Journal a bit, have a time of prayer, making notes in my prayer journal as guided by the Spirit. Time to time, I will take refuge for a time of refreshing, and extended time of prayer, Bible reading and meditation on God's Word.

Major Problems I see Christians facing. Christians don't have problems.... (just kidding). Christians, I believe have been under challenged and truly are up to living more abundantly. Therefore, while I regularly address problems and struggles of the day, I primarily like to "address" the problems before an ambulance is needed by building a fence at the top of the cliff, developing family with direction to help people stay as far away from the edge (problems) as possible. However, reality is, we all have *friends* who are having problems therefore in order to help *friends*, I aim head on into the challenges Christians face daily, discovering what God's Word clearly says about..... finding significance and purpose, setting goals, priorities and understanding vision. What is success? What about family? Marriage? Children? Is work important? What about finances? Define Missions. Being a good Sport. What is most important? Sin, what is, what isn't? Important Habits. What is the big deal about Church? Cults/Religions. God's friend. Home Improvement. Finish Strong. Home Security.... Bring it on....

I grew up in an incredible Christian home, with very godly parents. I attended Church for as long as I can remember, and I usually enjoyed those times of my growing years. I invited Jesus Christ into my life at the age of nine years old and was baptized in June of 1971 at Taylors First Baptist Church, in South Carolina. I grew within a very vibrant Student Ministry, and was discipled by my Student Ministry Pastor.
